

### **MY LEARNING JOURNEY**

#### Namaste.

Reflecting on the journey of HUHT, I want to express my belief that if we are fortunate, it's our duty to help those who are not as fortunate. My father, Mr. R.K. Gupta, is my role model. He has always taught us to keep performing our duty towards the society.

One day on my way to school, I saw a group called 'Udbhas' teaching less fortunate children outside, near my home. It was a moment of realization that while I am living in comfort, many people do not even have a roof over their heads. That moment sparked the beginning of my journey. Then, when a devastating earthquake hit Gujarat in 2001, some friends, family members and I went there to provide aid to those in need. Then, in 2005, when there was a Tsunami in Tamil Nadu, we visited Nagapattinam to help the fishermen who lost their livelihood. These experiences made us want to do more. That's when we officially registered 'Help Us Help Them.' Subsequently, we initiated two projects to educate less fortunate children: we opened a school in Mallickpur, South 24 Parganas, in 2006, and the 'School on Wheels' Education for a Meaningful Tomorrow project for street children in Kolkata in 2013.

In 2024, we embark on a new chapter with the Adhigam Bhoomi—a free residential learning centre for 1000 rural girls. Its curriculum is the part of an ambitious project aimed at reconstructing rural India through skill-based education, fostering self-realization, and Atmanirbharta. I express my deepest gratitude to my father, HUHT's former governing members - Sheetal Gupta, Chandrika Thirani, Ridhi Agarwalla, Anubhuti Jain Surana, Gunjan Shroff Tafti and Niket Jain—and present governing members—Ashish Chowdhary, Ravi Kumar Dugar, Karan Goenka, Priti Gupta, Megha Modi and Swati Sarawagi, as well as to all friends and well-wishers. Together, we continue to sow the seeds of change.

### **GENESIS OF A MISSION**

### 2001: Relief Work in Earthquake-hit Gujarat

It all began, almost spontaneously, when a big earthquake hit Gujarat in 2001. Some caring individuals felt the need to help the people in trouble.

### **FUNDRAISING AND ACTION**

- · We raised Rs. 12 lakh from Kolkata's friends and families.
- Assembled 2,000 kits with utensils, tents, and food in Ahmedabad.
- · Traveled 300 km to Adhoi village with 3 loaded trucks for distribution.

### CHALLENGE

- Faced the challenge of aiding villagers who had already received assistance.
- We upheld the commitment to providing aid to those who hadn't received help.

#### HELP FROM RAF

- Sought assistance from the Rapid Action Force (RAF) in Ahmedabad.
- Stayed at the RAF camp for three days, utilizing wireless communication to identify areas lacking aid.
- Loaded relief materials onto RAF trucks and, escorted by 25 armed jawans, reached remote areas, distributing kits to 2,000 families.

### A VALUABLE LESSON

- Learned flexibility in plans and decisions, adapting to changing situations.
- This experience marked the beginning of a commitment to helping others, evolving from disaster relief to building better futures.

### **GROWING IN COMMITMENT**

#### 2005: Tsunami Relief Work at Tamil Nadu

In 2005 a devastating tsunami struck India. Many lives got affected. And once again, we couldn't remain silent.

#### PROMPT ACTION

- We mobilized funds amounting to Rs. 18 lakhs through various connections and initiatives.
- · Our destination was Nagapattinam in Tamil Nadu.

#### A MAJOR DECISION

- Upon arrival, we conducted a thorough survey, forged a partnership with Indian Overseas Bank, guided by Mr. S. C. Gupta (Ex-Chairman, IOB) and judiciously utilized the collected funds.
- Recognizing that the government had already provided assistance to the affected population, we decided to focus on aiding fishermen who had lost their boats and fishing nets in the calamity.

#### **PAYING THE INSTALMENT**

- Our strategy involved obtaining a loan from the partnered bank to help these fishermen resume their profession.
- We took the responsibility for paying the first instalment of the loan payback on their behalf.
   Additionally, we distributed essential supplies to the affected community.

#### **CREATING HUHT**

- This impactful experience motivated us to create a more structured platform for our humanitarian efforts.
- Therefore, with the collective support of friends and family members, 'Help Us Help Them' (HUHT) was established and officially registered under the Society Act. We stood at the threshold of a new chapter.





### SOWING THE SEEDS OF CHANGE

### 2006 Rural School at Mallickpur

After much searching, in the year 2006 'Help Us Help Them' decided on Mallickpur as the site for its first educational venture for less fortunate children.

#### THE CHALLENGE

- The area, located in the South 24 Parganas district of West Bengal, has 10-12 villages.
   Many kids, some only 9-10 years old, went to work every day in leather factories in Kolkata from these villages, often travelling alone without any guardians.
- Most of the parents were daily labourers. Practices of attending schools or pursuing proper education was largely absent, especially among girls.
- HUHT aimed to transform the scenario by establishing the Rural School at Mallickpur and appointing local teachers.

#### PERSISTENCE AND SUCCESS

 We went door to door to collect students. It was very difficult to convince the parents, many of whom dismissed us at once. We persisted.

- We began the school with 2 teachers and 10 students.
- Currently, we have 15 teachers in this school, and 350 students come to study here.
- Here, we offer Primary Education (Nursery to Class-1) and Supplementary Education (Class-2 to Class-10), following the West Bengal Board syllabus.

#### **COMMITMENT & RESULTS**

- In 2019, HUHT decided to enrol students from here in recognized schools, often with boarding facilities.
- Most of the students have passed and performed well in Madhyamik and Higher Secondary exams.
- Students from this school continue to win prestigious swimming competitions.

### **SCHOOL ON WHEELS**

### 2013: Moving classroom on streets

Providing education to street children in the city through educational buses was our long-cherished dream. After the valuable experience at Mallickpur, HUHT ventured into that direction.

#### KIND COOPERATION

- · We wrote a letter to Mr. Ratan Tata, the then Chairman of Tata Group, requesting a bus from Tata Motors for this purpose. Their representatives from Mumbai came to survey our efforts, and upon their assessment, Tata Motors generously donated 50% of the funds required for the bus. The remaining 50% was provided by the Oriental Bank of Commerce.
- · The second bus was donated by the 'Round Table' organization.

### **SERIOUS CHALLENGES**

- · Many of the street children were drug addicts.
- · They were involved in begging and other disorienting activities, often in gangs.

#### PREPARING THE BASE

- · Before launching the bus on the streets, we did a survey among the street children for 2 months. We tried to understand their specific situations and needs. Slowly, we earned their confidence through this groundwork.
- · We informed each police station in the relevant areas about our initiative, seeking their assistance.
- · We appointed paid staff teachers and helpers - for the proper execution of the initiative.

#### WHEELS START ROLLING

- · Finally, in 2013, The School on Wheels (SOW) hit the streets, moving from one location to
- · We transformed the bus-interior into a classroom.

### STYLE OF FUNCTIONING

- The students of School on Wheels at each location are bathed properly and assisted in wearing uniforms by our helpers – before entering the bus. The bus stays at each location for 2 hours.
- School on Wheels operates as a regular school. It follows and takes exams according to the West Bengal Board's syllabus. Attendance records are duly maintained. New admissions take place every January.

#### **PROVIDING MORE PLATFORMS**

- At the end of each school year, we place all School on Wheels students in regular government-supported or small private schools in their localities.
- In 2019, we decided to send School on Wheels students to boarding schools all over India to help them leave behind bad habits and live in a better environment.
- So far, more than 300 students have benefited from this program, and some of them are doing really well in their studies.

### COVID-19 RELIEF WORK

2021: Empathy in the time of pandemic



A much-needed relief: HUHT provided daily meals to nearly 500 people in the border areas as part of our responsible efforts to address the emergency situation caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. We collaborated with the 85F to carry out this task.



Throughout the lockdown days, we assisted the families of students from HUHT's rural school in Mallickpur by providing basic necessities.



Hundreds of miles away from their homes, the truck drivers on the BT road received relief materials from HUHT.



The trucks were haited in a long queue due to the lockdown, leaving the dirvers feeling helpies. HUHT was glad to alleviate their distress in those trying moments.



Amidst the unprecedented onslaught of the COVID-19 pandemic, the world found itself grappling with waves of uncertainty, prompting widespread lockdowns that left virtually no one untouched. However, it was the economically disadvantaged segments of society that bore the brunt of these distressful times.

'Help Us Help Them' (HUHT) swiftly responded to this crisis by initiating a noble mission aimed at extending crucial aid and services to these vulnerable communities. Teaming up with the Border Security Force (BSF), HUHT orchestrated the distribution of 20,000 masks, 15,000 soaps, and 2,000 gloves across border regions, effectively combating the spread of the virus in these areas.

Additionally, HUHT's efforts included the provision of essential sustenance in the form of food kits, ensuring 1,000 families received vital nourishment from April through mid-May a total of 450,000 meals distributed during this period of acute need.


### **Brief Description of the Project**




## Milestones for the Blueprint GreenPrint

Pilot: Expanded implementation of curriculum in 100 schools for sampling and validation in 2025

Execution plan for implementation across rural India schools:

- 1) Creating database of all government schools in rural areas with details of State, District, Village name, Panchayat, education board followed, Annual Budget of each school as provided by the Govt, Break up of actual expenses under different heads by each school vis a vis Budget any unused fund as per the annual budget
- 2)Building a database of grassroots NGOs and mapping each rural school to a nearby NGO within a 20 km radius for curriculum implementation across 12 lakh rural schools
- 3)**Budget Estimation** for Executing the curriculum over 12 lac+ rural schools by end of Sep 2026
- 4) Extracting current **CSR Budget detail**s of PSUs, Navratnas and private co.s and allotment of funds in various social sector
- 5)Linkage of our proposal to the New Education Policy
- 6) **Constitution of India:** Check for provisions for decision making by Central Govt on Rural Education at India level (Central vs State powers and responsibility)
- 7) Creating a **communication plan** for presentation to Govt of India


